

This chrono was prepared through the request of the counselor and inmate. The undersigned has seen the Subject over a period of several years for counseling. Sirhan has shown a wide range of emotion, feeling and affect regarding the instant offense and his long term incarceration as a result. In April 1983 he was considerably upset by the delay in his previously scheduled Board appearance. He is maintaining disciplinary free, exercises regularly in the wing yard and has an excellent work record as a server during the 3 meals provided to inmates in his wing. He enjoys listening to the radio and has maintained good relations with staff and other inmates. He has periodic family visits and maintains close contact by telephone and letters. He shows no grandiosity and no disturbed thought or ideation. He seems to have arrived at a realistic plan in the event that he is paroled. It is felt that he is able to maintain demonstrated gains and have potential for violence below average. He is bright, articulate, and well motivated. Based on his demonstrated adjustment and insight and

This writer has known Inmate Sirhan, B21014, for the last seven (7) years, four (4) of which as his housing unit floor officer on Facility B. As I observed and interacted with him on a daily basis, he exhibited no unusual behaviors and was always conforming to the rules and regulations of the institution. He worked in the culinary and attended group meetings and church services, regularly, as available. I found him to be very upright in his character and respectful in his conduct with staff and with his peers, without any deviance. He is polite and well-spoken, and he exemplifies the rare "model Inmate" description that staff wishes to see in the inmate population. Sirhan is punctual in his work assignment and he avoids conflict.

I further gathered from my observations that Mr. Sirhan is genuinely committed to his recovery and reformation. He appeared to spend much of his spare time reading educational literature, exercising, and being pleasantly available to other inmates as an academic mentor and recovery sponsor. These actions, I conclude, are indicative of a sincere passion on Mr. Sirhan's part for not only his own rehabilitation, but that of others as well.

In view of the foregoing, it is my personal belief that when Mr. Sirhan is released into society he would become an asset to and productive member of his community.
